



Hymnic Notes:

The processional is Charles Wesley's magisterial hymn, alive with vivid
biblical metaphors and images of Christ's second advent, with allusions to his
Ascension, set to the splendid, expansive, inviting tune HELMSLEY. The tune
is named after a small town in Yorkshire, England.

The recessional is an invitation to allow our hearts to receive Christ's grace
and love during this Advent season. It is a metaphor for the dialogue,
probably sung by a priestly choir, in Psalm 24:7-10 (see KJV text on left facing
page of the hymn) that accompanies the opening of the temple gates to allow
entrance of the procession of the ark, the latter representing the immediate
presence of The Lord of Hosts.
