Hymnic Notes: The text for “How Can We Name a Love” was written by contemporary hymn writer Brian Wren. Wren was ordained in Britain’s United Reformed Church and holds degrees from Oxford University. His hymns have been published internationally, and he is on the faculty of Columbia Theological Seminary in Atlanta. The tune, written by Frank Shepherd in 1915, is more commonly associated with the hymn, “This is My Father’s World.”

The British composer Percy Fletcher was mainly known for his theater music and music composed for brass band. He also composed extensively for organ, including three volumes of hymn tune preludes, a “Fountain Reverie,” which was written to depict the rush of water flowing from fountains, and his most famous piece, “Festival Toccata,” which is being played today for our postlude.


