

Today's Music: In 1719, Isaac Watts published a hymnal entitled *The Psalms of David, Imitated*. In this hymnal, he paraphrased many of the Psalms, but in a very different style than many of his predecessors. The order of the day was to keep any paraphrase as close to the text as possible. Watts decided to do otherwise, and his interpretations of the psalms are quite loose, in an effort to write something new while keeping the spirit of the Psalm. "Jesus Shall Reign," his versification of Psalm 72, is no different. He interprets the psalm using a Christological lens. This philosophy attempted to connect the Old and New Testaments into one great story where Jesus is the King referenced in these Old Testament psalms.
