written hundreds of hymns that have been used in multiple denominations
around the world. About hymn writing Bell writes, “I discovered that seldom
did our hymns represent the plight of poor people to God. There was nothing
that dealt with unemployment, nothing that dealt with living in a multicultural
society and feeling disenfranchised. There was nothing about child abuse...that
reflected concern for the developing world, nothing that helped see ourselves
as brothers and sisters to those who are suffering from poverty or persecution.”
