Ira Sankey, a good friend of hymn author Fanny Crosby, once related this story about the comfort "Blessed Assurance" provides: "During the recent war in the Transvaal,' said a gentleman at my meeting in Exeter Hall, London, in 1900, 'when the soldiers going to the front were passing another company whom they recognized, their greetings used to be, "Four-nine-four, boys; four-nine-four;" and the salute would invariably be answered with "Six further on, boys; six further on." The significance of this was that, in 'Sacred Songs and Solos,' a number of copies of the small edition of which had been sent to the front, number 494 was 'God be with you till we meet again'; and six further on than 494, or number 500, was 'Blessed Assurance, Jesus is mine'" (My Life and Sacred Songs, 69.
