Today's Music

"Resurrection," by Larry King, one of today's opening voluntary pieces, portrays in freely structured fragments the four aspects of the resurrection. "Lament" combines the liturgical mourning of the plainsong chant *Vinea mea electa* (O my vineyard, I planted and tended thee...and thou hast prepared a cross for thy savior) with an expression of contemporary grief. "The Rising" grows quietly from this grief, using twelve-tone rows and techniques to express its cosmic nature. "The Ecstasy" develops an alleluia strain with improvisatory embellishments. "Reflection" combines the liturgical rejoicing of the plainsong introit for Easter Day, *Haec dies* (This is the day which the Lord has made), with alleluia fragments.

Bulletin Cover

"The Risen Lord" is a painting by Dr. James He Qi, currently a resident of California and Artist-In-Residence at Fuller Theological Seminary. He grew up in China, and his religious art is heavily influenced by that heritage. He and his works have been seen and revered by Christians around the world. At our invitation, He Qi visited West End UMC several years ago to display some of his works and give a presentation about the influences on his work and his growing up during the revolution. We have often used his paintings as bulletin covers.
