



Today's Music

In 1868, George J. Elvey composed the tune, *Diademata*, specifically for the hymn text, *Crown Him with Many Crowns*. Albert Bailey writes, "This is another of those hymns that can be sung at different paces, but which don't lend themselves to changes in volume. Rather, *Crown Him with Many Crowns* builds with pomp, the second half of each verse making you want to stand to sing" (*The Gospel in Hymns*, 76).

Bulletin Cover Art

"Joseph's Brothers Beg for Help," by Jacopo Carucci da Pontormo, later known as "Pontormo." He lived from 1494 to early 1557, and this painting was created around 1515. He knew and, as a youth, had apprenticeships under several well-known artists in Florence, Italy, including Leonardo da Vinci. His work was often supported by the Medici family.
