Hymnic Notes:
The processional hymn invites us to praise Jesus Christ in all times and all
places. Its unusual structure of rhymed couplets followed by a refrain 'May
Jesus Christ be praised,' is aptly expressed in Joseph Barnby's only enduring
tune of the 246 he composed.

The recessional consist of seven verses from Charles Wesley's 22-verse poem,
titled 'After preaching (in a church)', that his brother John (never shy to alter
others texts!) made into a two-part-hymn: Verses 1-3 proclaim the Lordship
and authority of Christ, and verses 4-6 are words of personal devotion and
dedication that conclude with a prayer that the singer's dying words might
echo those of John the Baptist, 'Behold the Lamb of God' (John 1:29).
