Hymnic Notes: The processional is a paraphrase of the Trinitarian articles in the Apostles Creed (see hymnal 881, and 882). The first stanza is in praise of the Trinity, followed by two stanzas relating to the Son and the Holy Ghost.

The recessional is based on a traditional benediction that in part reflects St. Paul's reminder to the young church of Thessalonica (1 Thes. 5:14-18) to rebuke the unruly, encourage the faint-hearted, help the weak, be patient, refuse to retaliate, pray without ceasing, and give thanks in all circumstances.
