Hymnic Notes: The processional, Charles Wesley's hymn for Easter Day in  
praise of the risen Christ, is written in the present tense and thus unites us  
with the first communities to experience and witness to the power of the  
resurrection. 'Easter people raise your voices,' by United Methodist pastor and  
social activist, William M. James, who ministered to gangs and the homeless  
in East Harlem, New York City, reminds us that every day is Easter with  
the resurrection power to 'right the wrongs,' and 'triumph over every foe.'  
The recessional is freely translated from the eighth-century Greek Easter  
"Golden Canon," also called the "Queen of Canons," linking the mighty acts of  
God: the Hebrews' exodus and Jesus' resurrection.

**"Can Life Really Come Out of Death?"**

**Matthew 28: 1-10**

After the Sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary  
Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly  
there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending  
from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His  
appearance was like lightning and his clothing white as snow. For fear  
of him the guards shook and became like dead men. But the angel said  
to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus  
who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said.  
Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples,  
'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of  
you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you."  
So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy, and ran to tell his  
disciples. Suddenly Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they  
came to him, took hold of his feet, and worshiped him. Then Jesus said  
to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee;  
there they will see me."
