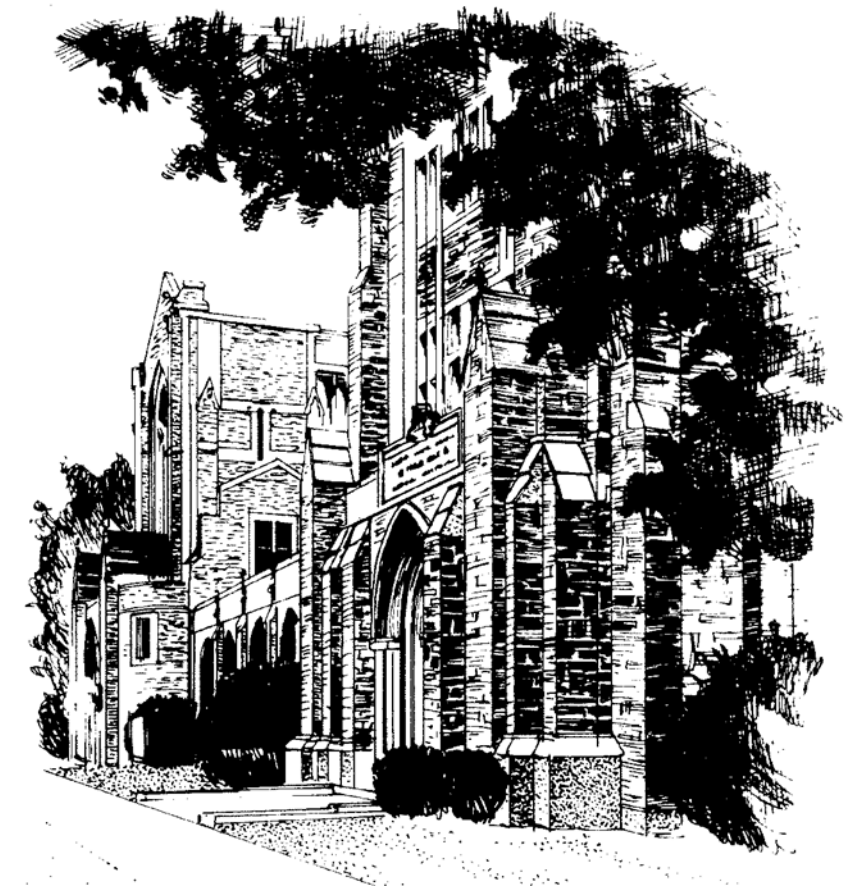

Hymnic Notes: "O Worship the King" was written by Robert Grant in 1833. He wrote a text that helps us see the creation story in a new light with each verse to be a meditation on different aspects of the creation story. "Rejoice ye Pure in Heart" was written by Edward Plumptre in 1865. The tune, Marion, was written by Arthur Messiter in 1889 specifically for this text. He named it after his wife and included in a hymnal that he compiled for Trinity Episcopal Church in New York City where he served as organist from 1866-1897.
