Hymnic Notes: “I’ll Praise My Maker While I’ve Breath” was written by Issac
 Watts and first appeared in *Psalms of David* from 1719. Watts originally wrote
 six stanzas. John Wesley adapted the text by using only stanzas 1, 3, 4, and 6,
 and included it in his publication, *Psalms and Hymns*, in 1737 and again in 1743.
 Henry Smart wrote the hymn tune Lancashire in 1835 for use at a missions
 festival in Blackburn, Lancashire, England. The tune is usually associated with
 the Easter hymn, “The Day of Resurrection.” It first appeared with today’s text,
 “Lead On, O King Eternal,” as part of *The Methodist Hymnal* published in 1905.
