Today's Music: "Now Thank We All Our God" was written by Martin Rinkart
sometime around the Thirty Years' War in the 1630s, although it wasn't
published until 1663. His inspiration for the first two stanzas comes from the
Apocryphal Book of Ecclesiasticus, chapter 50:22-24, which reads in part, "Now
bless God of all, who in every way does great things." The third stanza is a
paraphrase of the Gloria Patri, originally composed in Greek in the fourth
century, although some of it was written as early as 95 CE. The second verse
hints at the sickness and disease of the Thirty Years' War.
