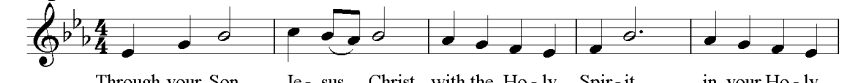

ADVENT MISSIONS MARKET

During the Sundays of Advent vendors will be in Reed Hall, including Chimes for Justice (stained glass/stepping stones), Harvest Hands (coffees and soaps), The Little Match Girl, Ten Thousand Villages, as well as items we've brought back from our trip to Guatemala. These vendors will be in Reed Hall shortly before early service through to fifteen minutes after the late worship service.

ADVENT SPECIAL OFFERING // LUNCHES FOR HOPE PROGRAM

This year's Advent Offering will go to the Lunches for Hope Program in the Dassa-Zoume region of Benin, Africa to help provide a daily lunch to the 30 girls enrolled in the program. Before this program, girls without this lunch money asked for the money from men who took advantage of their situation. West End funded this program last year and there was a dramatic decrease in girls dropping out of school, early pregnancy and trafficking. Our goal is \$5,400 which will fully fund lunches for one year. CANDLELIGHTING SERVICE // SUNDAY, DECEMBER 11

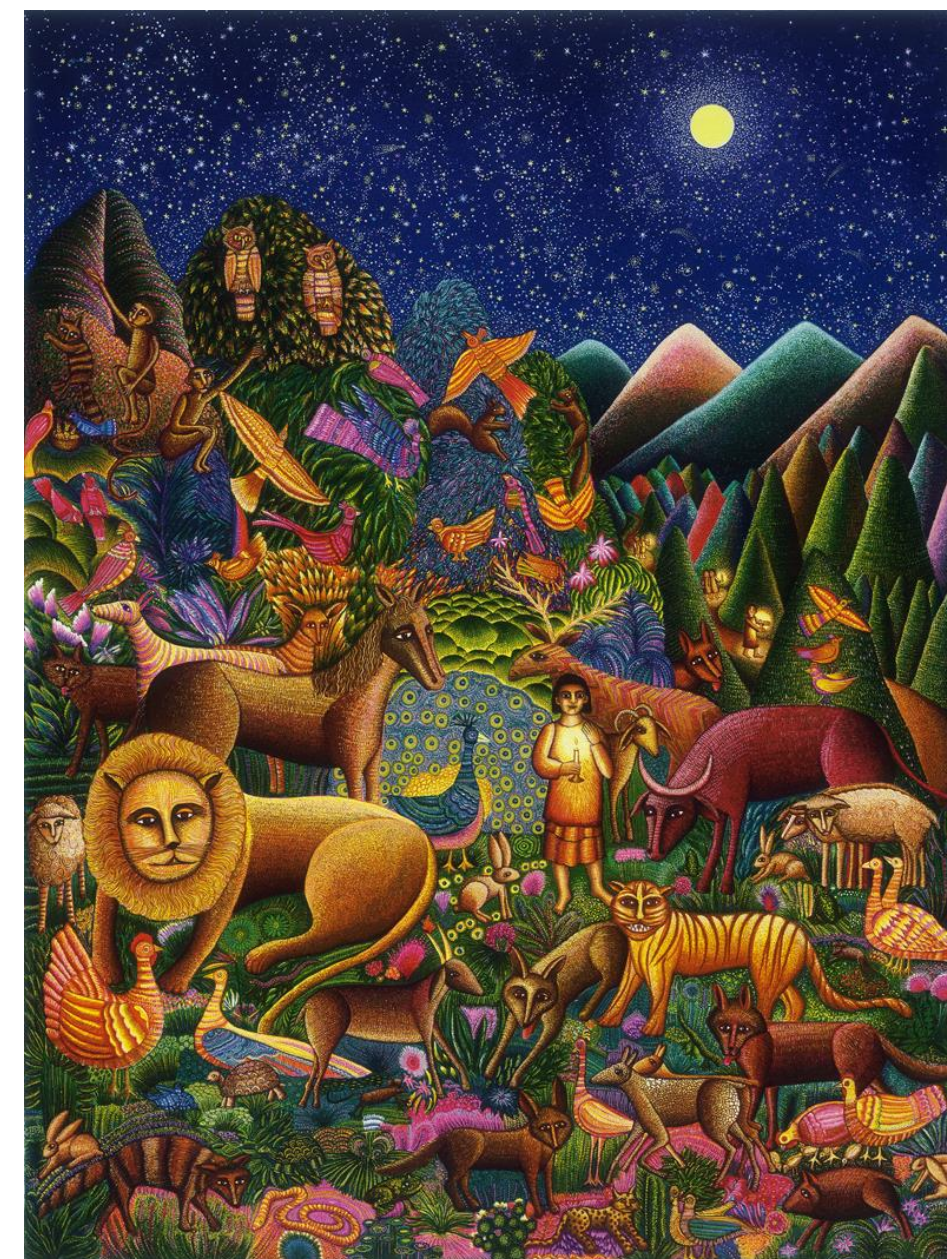
The Candlelighting Service is a long time West End tradition featuring all the singing choirs and all the handbell choirs. At 5:10 p.m., the handbell choirs begin ringing carols with the service beginning at 5:30 p.m. in the Sanctuary. The service retells the Christmas story through scripture, from the prophecy to the birth, with carols being sung by the choirs and congregation. The service ends with lighting of candles and singing of Silent Night. It is a very meaningful way to celebrate the Christmas season by focusing on the birth of the Christ-child and the implication it has on our lives today. Early arrival is encouraged as this service fills up quickly.
