Today's Music: Today's Music: There is a legend that Augustus Toplady was inspired to write our recessional hymn, "Rock of Ages, Cleft for Me," after finding shelter from a thunderstorm in a cleft in a rock at Burrington Combe in Somerset, England in 1776. While evidence to support that story is lacking, it does provide a vivid image through which to understand the hymn. Christ and His redemptive work on the cross are like that cleft in the rock, where we can find shelter from the deluge of sin's guilt and power.

What is needed in this day and age to challenge the injustices of racism? What can we learn from the horrors of the racism in the past, the commitment of those who participated in the civil rights movement, and how that learning translates into real change toward the beloved community?
