Today's Music: For our recessional hymn, the tune Germany is by William
Gardiner, who attributed the melody to Beethoven. It is unclear which piece
Gardiner referred to in his attribution. The composer and editor Erik Routley
traced the tune to a melody in Mozart's *The Magic Flute*, while others have
attributed it to a melody from Beethoven's Piano Trio, Op. 70, no. 2. What is
likely is that Gardiner remembered a number of different melodic fragments
