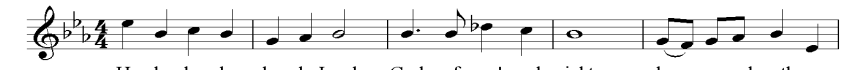

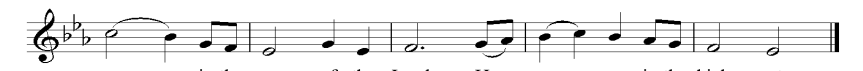

Today’s Music: Nicaea is John Dykes’s most sung tune; a perfect match for the romantic yet refined literary qualities of Heber’s hymn, “Holy, Holy, Holy.” In naming the tune Nicaea, Dykes has cleverly interrelated its opening and reiterated triadic motif with the doctrine of the Trinity formulated at the Council of Nicaea, 325, and the subject of the hymn. “This Is a Day of New Beginnings” was written by United Methodist Hymnal editor and West End member Carlton “Sam” Young. Sam passed away on May 22, 2023, after a long battle with cancer. We sing this hymn today in honor of him, his service to West End, and his tireless work for the United Methodist Church.
