Today's Music

For over two centuries, "How Firm a Foundation" is a hymn that has assured believers of the faithfulness of Christ and the certainty of hope. The first verse acts almost as an introduction to the rest of the text, giving us cause to stop and ponder the Word of assurance that God has given us, described in greater detail in the next four verses. Those four verses are, in fact, paraphrases of Scripture passages: Isaiah 41:10, 43:2, Romans 8:3-39, Hebrews 13:5, and Deuteronomy 31:6. In the words of this hymn, we carry with us the Word from God, and the call to trust in that Word. But God's Word is expansive and not limited to letters on a page – the fifth verse moves us to a trust in the Word made flesh in Jesus Christ. Thus, we are assured by the words we sing, the Word we are given, and the Word made flesh, of the steadfastness of God and His unfailing love.

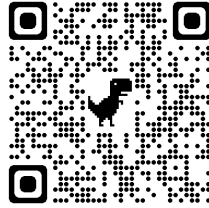

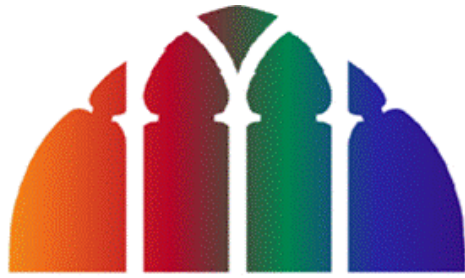
NEWSLETTER MAILING HELP NEEDED
