Where we have failed to be faithful,

All: Lord, have mercy.

One: Though we are consecrated to "lift up our voice against all

human wrong," we remember how at times we remained silent and did not stand up for the oppressed in the streets or

in the halls of power. Where we have failed to speak up,

All: Christ, have mercy.

Though with a scornful wonder the world sees us oppressed. By schisms rent asunder, by heresies distressed

yet saints their watch are keeping.
