AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR

Did you know that the church has an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) unit? It's located in the Minister's Robing Room off of the east side (pulpit side) of the choir loft through the door next to the metal cabinet. The AED unit is mounted to the wall straight ahead as you walk through the door. The unit is very user friendly and ready to go in case there is a medical emergency and you happen to be the first responder.
