Today's Music

Luther's famous, stirring hymn titled "A Hymn of Comfort" may have been written as a response to a number of circumstances, including the reoccurrence of the plague in Wittenberg and the martyrdom-death of a friend. It has been translated into 53 languages, with at least 100 English versions, and appears in most hymnals, including Roman Catholic ones. The hymn's central theme expressed in battle language, 'God in Christ is our only protection from the worldly forces of evil,' continues to strengthen believers' faith and resolve. It is one of the first hymns to 'Christianize' Hebrew psalms. In this instance, it is *Psalm 46*. As is the tradition of identifying chorale tunes, the tune name is from the first line of the German text, "Ein' feste Burg ist unser Gott."
