Today's Music

The original Dutch text of “We Gather Together,” “Wilt heden nu treden,” was first published in 1626 by Adrian Valerius in his *Nederlandsch Gedenckclanck*, although it may have been written earlier in the late 16th century. The author is unknown. This text was written in celebration of the freedom of the Netherlands from Spanish rule. Theodore Baker, an American music scholar, translated the text into English in 1894 for an anthem titled “Prayer of Thanksgiving.”

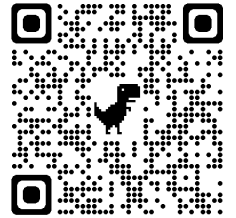

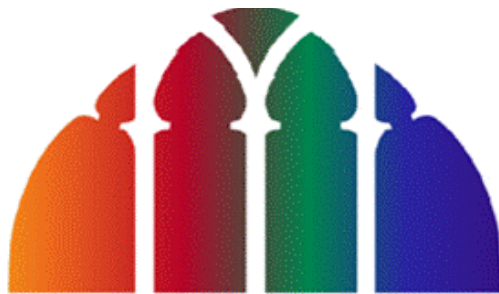
THE FEAST OF ST. NICHOLAS ♦ WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 6
