



Today's Music

In monasteries as early as the nineteenth century during Advent vespers the eight days before Christmas, seven "O" antiphons and an eighth antiphon to Mary were sung before and after the *Magnificat* (Mary's song from Luke chapter 1). A metrical form of the antiphons was prepared as early as the 12th century and a version printed from the 18th century was used by John Mason Neale for his translation—*O Come, O Come, Emmanuel*—in *Mediaeval Hymns and Sequences*, 1851.
