† Benediction

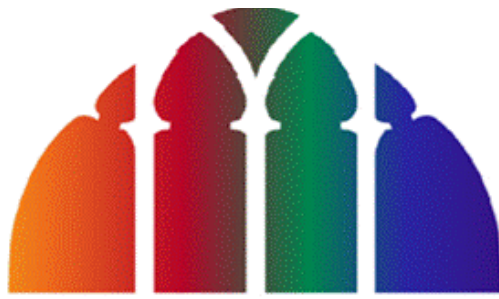
Voluntary
