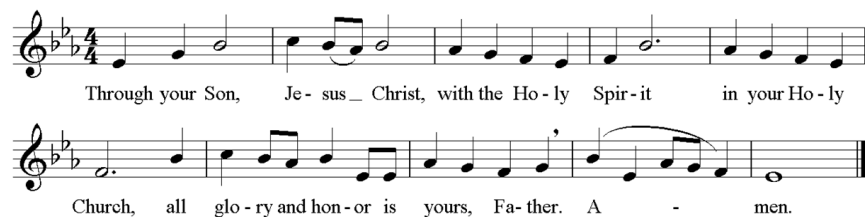

Bulletin Cover Art

“Transfiguration of Jesus,” a painting in 2004 by Armando Alemendar-Ara, who lives in Great Britain and is a co-founder of Neomodernism. He creates works in large measure reflecting the spirituality of his Sufi background as this transfiguration piece demonstrates. This painting gives the impression of colors dancing as warm colors of deep reds and oranges move upward like flames, transitioning to yellows before becoming three white points of light that seem transfixed on each other. By contrast, the rich, cool colors of the bottom and sides of the painting ground the movement of the warmer tones.

It is in the radically different character of the two days that we discover the meaning of each. If you attend the Jazz Mass, seriously consider attending one of the Ash Wednesday services as well. If you are a regular attender at an Ash Wednesday service, seriously consider participating in the Jazz Mass in preparation to experience the importance of the imposition of ashes that follows the next day. Ash Wednesday services will be on March 5 at 12 and 6:15 pm.
