Johann Jakob Schütz wrote "Sing Praise to God, Who Reigns Above," in German with nine stanzas. In 1675, he published it in his *Christliches Gedenkbüchlein*. The most common English translation in use is by Frances E. Cox from 1864, which was published in Orby Shipley's *Lyra Eucharistica* and her own *Hymns from the German*. Catherine Winkworth has also made a translation.

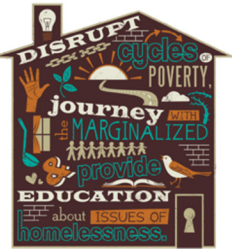
TABLETRANSFORMATIONS

TUESDAY NIGHT YOGA


