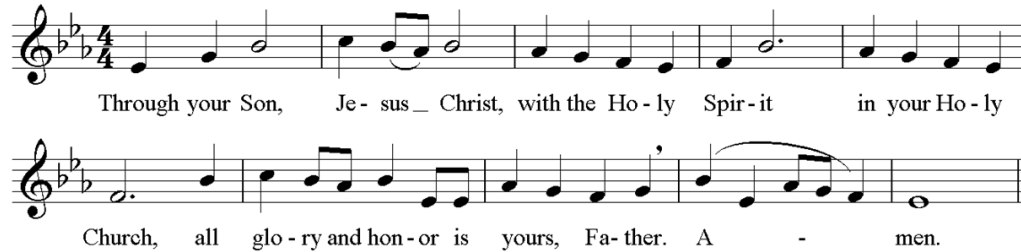

It might feel a little weird to sing "Joy to the World" in the middle of April; however, this hymn is more versatile than it may seem. Along with being relevant given our scripture reading today, it also fits the Easter message of Christ conquering sin and reigning in righteousness. Written by Watts in 1719, it is a paraphrase of Psalm 98:4-9. The American composer Lowell Mason adapted the tune in 1848 from Handel's *Messiah* (the chorus "Lift Up Your Heads"). Bulletin Cover Art

Today's cover art is a photograph taken from last week's Artemis II mission around the Moon. As our scripture lesson reads from John 1:4-5, "What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." In this photograph, we see Earth from the viewpoint of the Moon looking upon Australia, the Pacific Ocean, and the swirling clouds that cover both.

TRIVIA NIGHT // APRIL 24

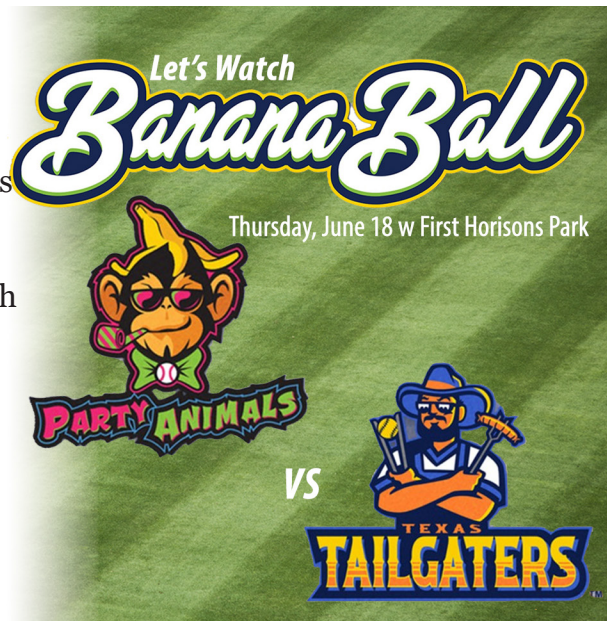
