Special Communion Offering

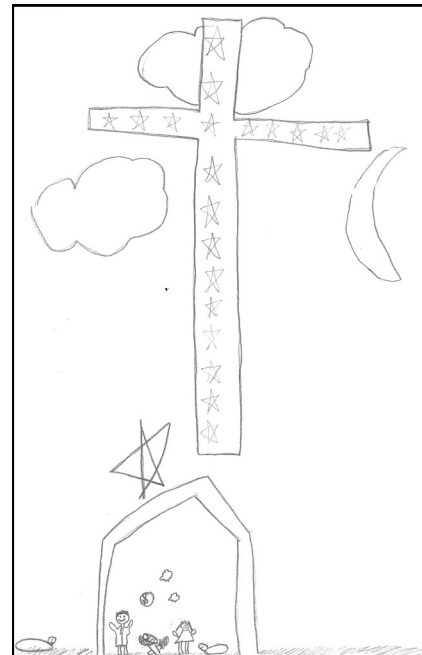
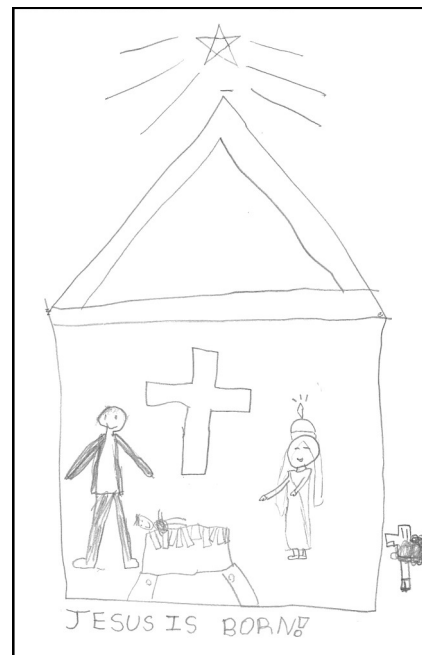
